
Locally they also used hydrogen peroxide to help Wellingborough minimise losses on their Mill Cotton snake lake. That club - among the better equipped was also able to swiftly deploy four big oxygenating pumps.

Weather-inspired killer deoxygenation incidents can involve massive algal die-offs, rotting vegetation, lack of oxygenating winds, and high fish stock levels.

Signs to watch for include fish gasping at the surface and, in some cases, numerous species shoaling together in unusual manner vying for what little oxygen
