Their programme, started five or more years back, has seen tens of thousands of fish added, all paid for with anglers' rod licence money.

Whether local big barbel stocks will ever get back to pre-otter levels only time will tell – but the EA, and the clubs and land-owners backing them, deserve full marks for trying.

AMONG the happy anglers proving that some decent-

sized barbel still exist in the upper river was Gary Teer, banking a 9-2 from Newport's length – a stamp of fish seemingly only marginally more common these days than the proverbial rocking horse droppings!

- NOT known for losing big fish, Olney-based Kevin Osborne lost a huge roach a potential 2lb+ river PB at the net in a Radwell Ouse match. He finished third with 4lb.
- DOWNSTREAM at Olney Dave Partridge had a PB 2-12 perch on worm.
- AND on MKAA's section of the Ouzel an Ouse tributary – Gary Maton saw the year out with four nice chub, plus some chublets, on bread on the lead.
